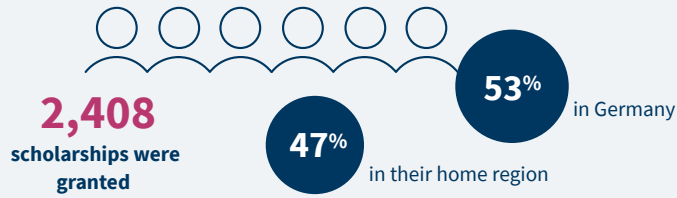


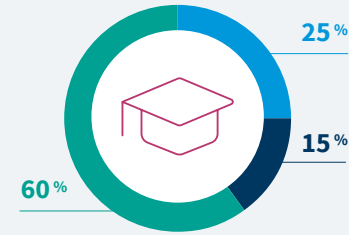

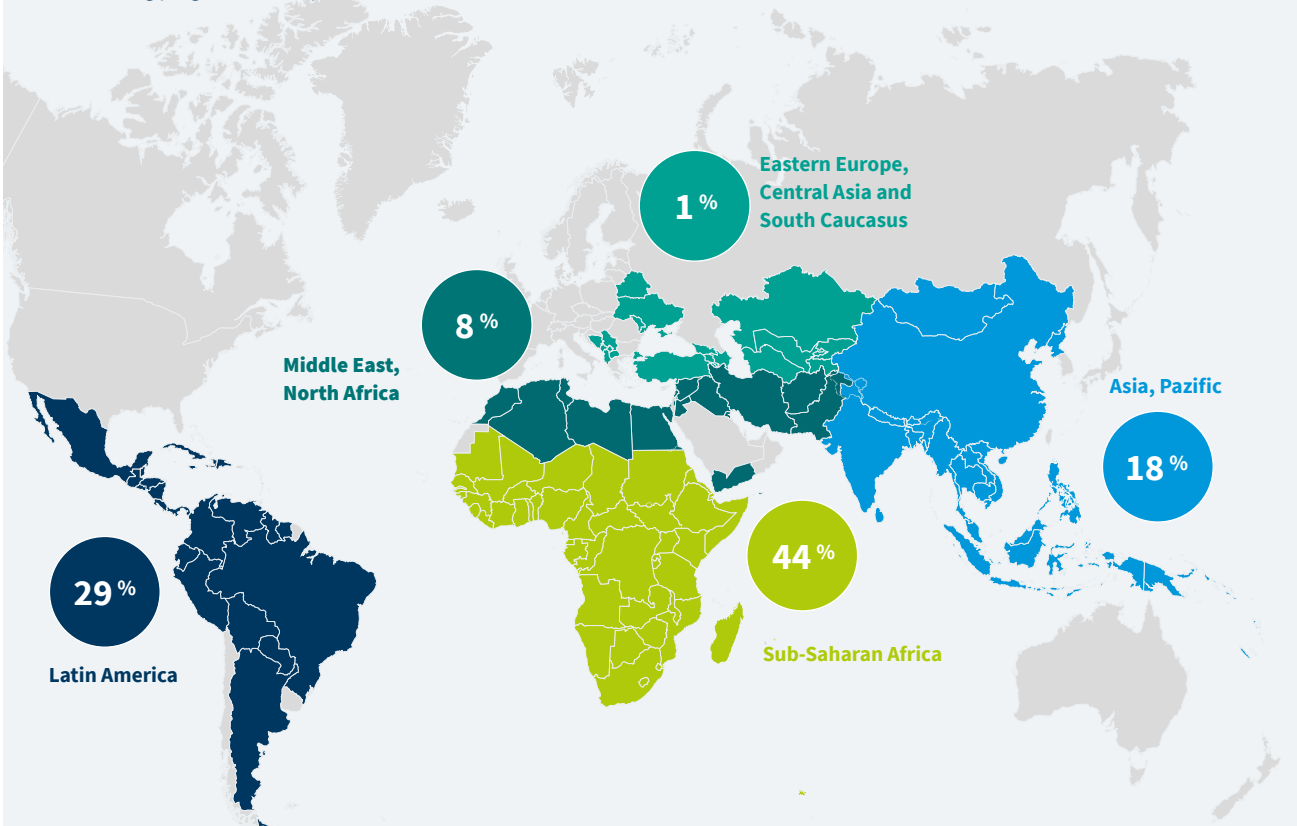
Top 5 target countries in the Global South



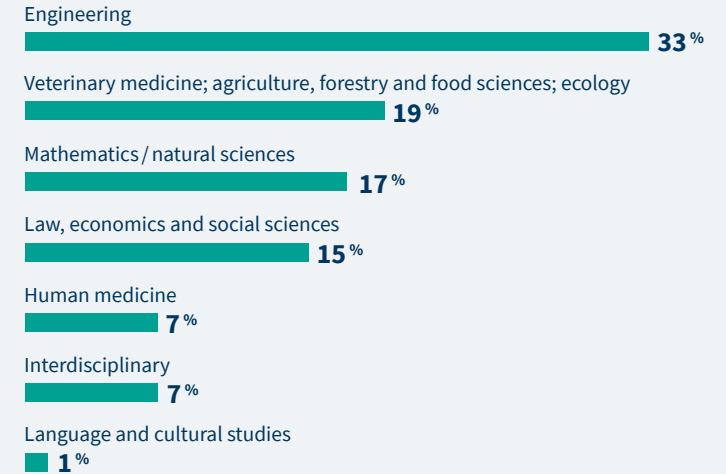

Our funding programmes are present and in demand in DAC countries



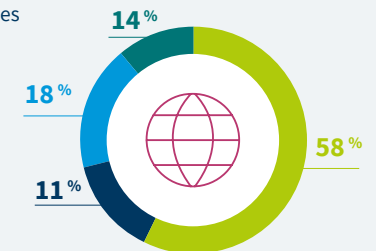

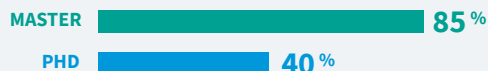

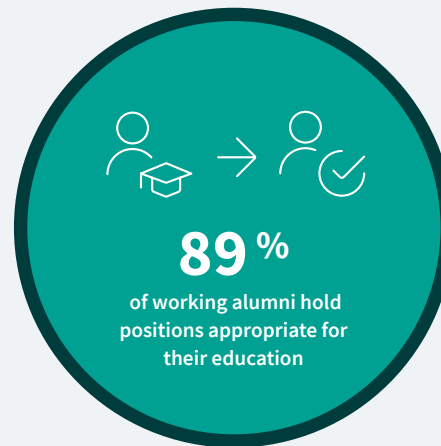
