Challenges

Food and nutritional security, including food safety, remains a major challenge in numerous sub-Saharan African (SSA) countries where food availability and food security vary seasonally. African indigenous vegetables complement the meagre food supply. However, value chains are underdeveloped with a high level of food losses.



Project Objectives

To contribute to developing food production and supply systems of underutilised horticultural crops – African Indigenous Vegetables.

To build individual, organisational, and institutional capacities for problem-oriented transdisciplinary (TD) research and education activities at PhD and postgraduate levels.







Good practices

- Practitioner networks which are supported from Scientists develop "their" Value Chains
- 4 PhD research "along the chain" synergies
- Study projects link research and education (business model course as potential result of postgraduate study project)
- Strong role of "local coordinators" (staff of partner institutes)
- Important: Regular communication and joint planning within the project (online and present) and with practitioners

Activities

Capacity development in transdisciplinary approaches particularly regarding innovation systems, food product development, postharvest management, processing, logistics/transportation and IT – and interlinked approaches:

- Mutual planning and evaluation (workshops, online-meetings):
- Interdisciplinary and methodological training;
- Develop Capacities of lecturers for facilitating postgraduate TD education activities;
- Three joint postgraduate TD studies;
- 4 PhD projects "along the chain";
- Jointly elaborated and tested postgraduate course;
