- Ticket for local <u>public</u> transport if applicable during Module 2, Module 3 and the Residencies
- Airport transfers (Module 3 in Accra, Residencies in Africa if applicable)
- Reimbursement up to 40 EUR for Health Insurance (for onsite Modules and Residencies obligatory)
- Visa fees (for visa processes at official entities)
- Mandatory vaccinations (for entry to countries with programme locations)
- Accommodation during the onsite Modules and Residency locations (from official programme arrival date to official programme departure date)
 - Please note: All programme related travels and accomodations will be arranged and booked by the DAAD and its supporting service provider
- Programme relevant entrance fees
- Daily allowance during the onsite Modules and Residencies
 (limited compensation for meals not provided in the programme)

Please note: the above-mentioned regulations state fixed amounts for daily allowances for each country/city. The allowances are newly calculated each year. The respective amounts have to be reduced according to the meals being provided in the programme.

A prerequisite for the selection of a candidate is the binding commitment to participate in all activities of TheMuseumsLab. The quality of the programme depends on Fellow's participation in all events and intense exchange, both among themselves and with the speakers and lecturers.

In case of selection employer must provide letter of consent and approved leave for training purpose which the candidate must submit.

- The application must include the following documents:
 - The completed TheMuseumsLab application form
 - A short CV (in english, max 2 pages)
 - A letter of recommendation
- The documents' name should contain your name, country of residence and the type of document (e.g., Lastname_firstname_Germany_CV)

Please make sure you have read all application documents carefully before submitting your application.

Please note: Completeness of the application will affect the applicant's eligibility as a participant.

After the review by the selection committee, the invited participants will be notified by end of April 2024.
