## **Student numbers**

There are presently 24<sup>1</sup> higher education institutions in Moldova, with 59,700<sup>2</sup> students on roll. Women make up 58.8% of all students. In 2021, 1,680 students were enrolled on PhDs (not including foreign students). In 2021, 522 foreign students completed PhDs. The majority (91%) were Romanian citizens, with Israelis (7%) making up the next largest group. Women accounted for 71.2% of foreign PhD students, an increase of 3.1 percentage points compared to 2020.


As a proportion of the total population, the cohort of students aged 19-23 has increased in recent years from 40% in 2015/16 to 46% in 2021/22. The number of higher education institutions fell from 31 to 24 in the same period. The number of PhD students rose from 1,556 in 2011 to 1,680 in 2021. Of these, the proportion of part-time PhD students rose more quickly and is now higher overall than full-time students (1,313 vs. 367 respectively in 2021).

## Languages

Romanian is the administrative language. The Moldovan population generally speak Romanian and Russian. Teaching is usually conducted in Romanian or Russian. In foreign language teaching, English has displaced French, which dominated for decades. German ranks third among foreign languages. There are currently no known English-language study programmes.

## **Recognition of degrees**

The Republic of Moldova joined the Bologna Process in May 2005. Since then it has implemented a range of reforms including the introduction of the European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS) at all Moldovan higher education institutions.<sup>3</sup> At present, 11 state higher education institutions are participating in Erasmus.4

Moldova became a candidate for EU membership on 23 June 2022. The separatist Transnistria region of Moldova is not internationally recognised as a state. For this reason, Transnistrian educational qualifications must be recognised in the Republic of Moldova in order to be accepted abroad.

# Academic cooperation with Germany

The HRK Higher Education Compass currently lists 21 cooperation partnerships between German and Moldovan higher education institutions. Two projects are currently funded through the DAAD's 'Eastern European Academic

Partnerships' programme, while three 'East-West Dialogue' projects between German and Moldovan higher education institutions are receiving funding. The 'Go East Project Initiation Visits' programme was opened up to Moldova as a partner country in October 2022.






DAAD funding Moldova 2012-2021




