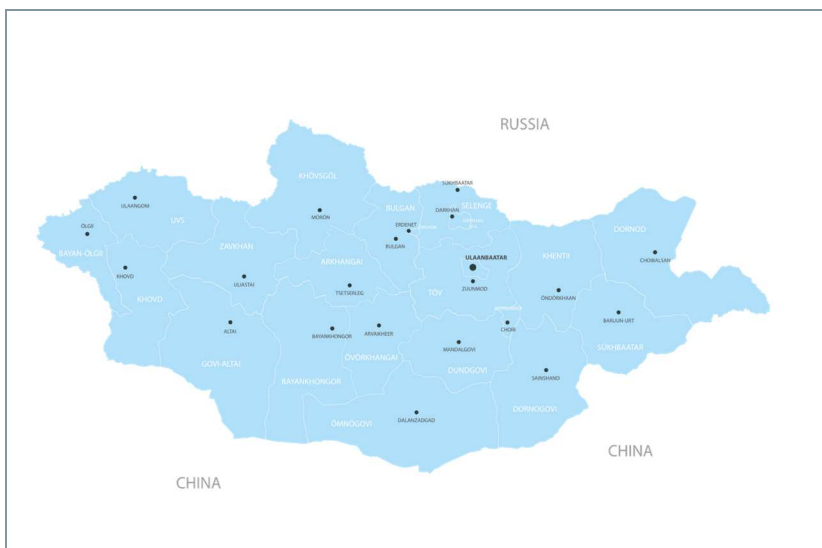

Current trends in academic exchange

In the winter semester of 2023/24, 721 Mongolian foreign students were studying in Germany. According to the HRK, there are currently 37 university partnerships between Germany and Mongolia (as of October 2024).

DAAD Activities

In 2023, the DAAD enabled 175 Mongolian scholarship holders to stay in Germany. In addition, 54 German scholarship holders were able to study and conduct research in Mongolia.

Research grants for foreign doctoral candidates and early-career researchers

DAAD scholarships offer foreign doctoral students and young scientists the opportunity to conduct research and further their education in Germany. There are funding opportunities for different qualification phases and career levels. The research fellowship programme is one of the DAAD's oldest and is offered worldwide. In 2023, 3 students from Mongolia received funding.

Scholarships for graduates of German schools abroad (PASCH schools)

Since 2001, the DAAD has been awarding a full scholarship (degree seeking) for studying in Germany. Applicants are nominated by their schools or the Central Agency for German Schools Abroad (ZfA). There is the possibility of further funding for very good bachelor's graduates in a master's programme. In 2023, eight students from Mongolia received this funding.

A central project of the cooperation is **the German-Mongolian University for Resources and Technology (DMHT)** in Nalaikh. The aim is to educate specialists and managers and to provide scientific and technological expertise for the development of an economy based on raw materials. On 16 June 2023, the tenth anniversary of the DMHT was celebrated in the Mongolian capital Ulaanbaatar with the participation of Mongolian ministries and the German representatives in Mongolia.

Funding for students on German degree programmes and binational German-foreign higher education institutions abroad

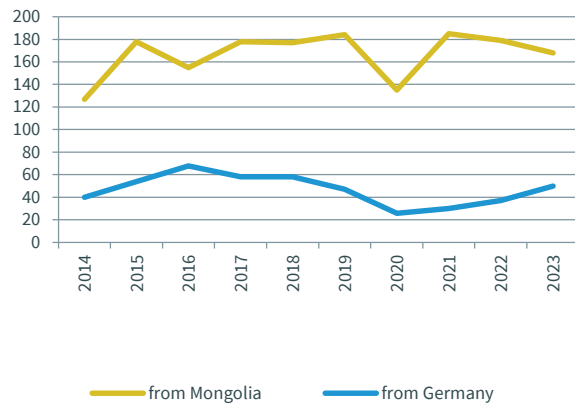
The DAAD, with funds from the Federal Foreign Office, supports German higher education institutions that successfully offer courses of study abroad: this programme provides them with funding to support high-performing non-German students who enrol in German higher education projects abroad. The scholarships are designed to increase the attractiveness of these transnational courses, strengthen their regional significance and emphasise their connection to Germany. In 2023, 57 people received this funding.

Within the framework of the **HAW.International** programme, the DAAD offers various programme components (study visits, stays abroad to work on theses, funding for participation in conferences and fairs), which create a comprehensive and visible opportunity for the target group of high-achieving students at universities of applied sciences, which can be used to specifically promote the various forms of international mobility in the context of practice-oriented studies at universities of applied sciences. In 2023, 30 individuals from Germany and Mongolia received funding.

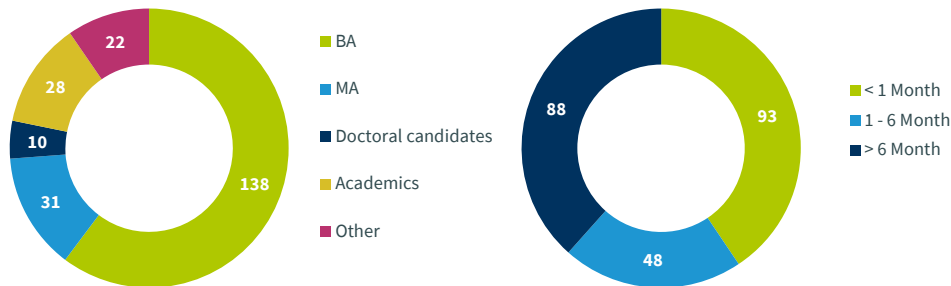

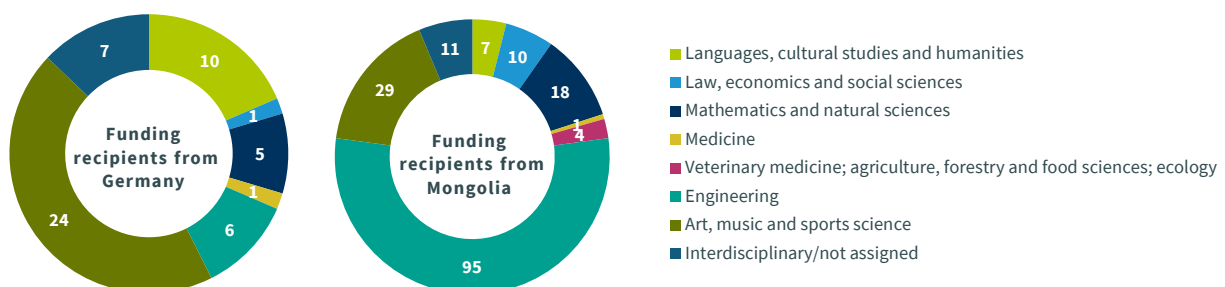
DAAD funding recipients Mongolia, 2014-2023 (excl. EU mobility grants)
