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Current Trends in Science Exchange

The Netherlands are one of the most significant destinations for German students. Higher education institutions in the Netherlands teach over 21,000 German students. This puts Germany in first place among the countries of origin for foreign students in the Netherlands, followed by Italy, China and Belgium. Dutch students most commonly choose to study abroad in Belgium, UK and the US, with Germany in fourth place (Global Flow of Tertiary-Level Students | UNESCO UIS).

DAAD Activities

The DAAD funds one standard lectureship and one subject-specific lectureship at the Duitsland Institut Amsterdam. The institute was set up in 1996 as part of the Dutch education ministry's 'Germany programme for higher education institutions. It functions as a competence centre for contemporary Germany in a European context at the interface between education, science and society. It initiates and stimulates German-Dutch networks and exchanges.

Scholarships for master's degrees abroad

This programme aims to give students the chance to gain a master's degree abroad and acquire experience of international studies. Students are able to pursue their own academic interests so they can develop to the best of their abilities in academic and personal capacities.

Internationalisation of universities of applied sciences

The DAAD supports students and academics from universities of applied sciences undertaking stays abroad. It also supports higher education institutions with strategic development and with cooperation projects with

international partners. The DAAD offers advice, training and discussion services to support institutions.

Integrated international degree programmes with double degrees

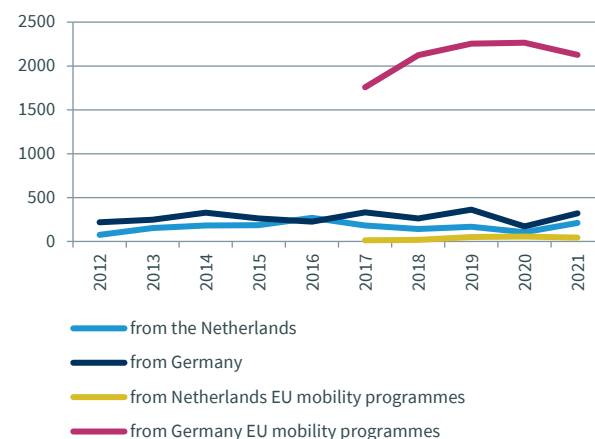
This programme funds study programmes at universities and universities of applied sciences that lead to degrees that are completed in part at a German higher education institution and in part at an institution abroad. This may be in the form of a 'joint degree' (awarded by both institutions) or a 'double degree' where each partner institution awards its own degree. The aim is for these study programmes to make a sustainable contribution to creating and expanding international structures at German

higher education institutions, as well as providing a boost to exchanges of teachers and learners. The DAAD is funding five projects with Dutch partners in the 2021/2022 academic year.

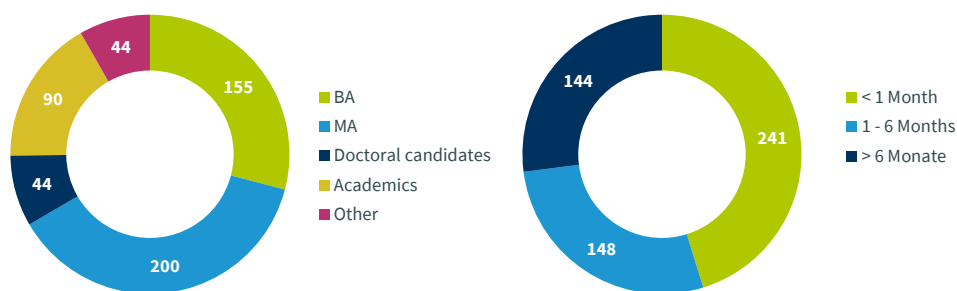

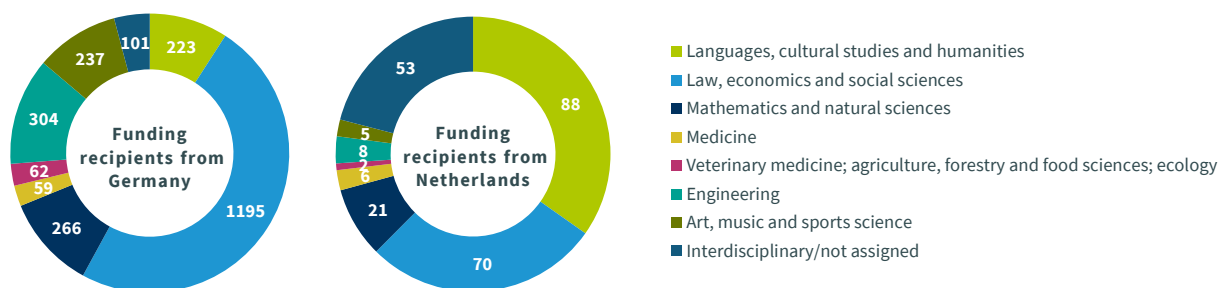
DAAD funding Netherlands 2012 – 2021 (figures from 2017 onwards include EU mobility programmes)
