Vision of Circle U.

Circle U. is the collaboration of seven European universities aiming at building an inclusive, research-intensive and interdisciplinary European campus with shared degrees and PhD programmes. The network, consisting of over 300,000 students and 30,000 academic and scientific staff members, is focusing on three main topics: climate, global health and democracy. The main goal is to establish unbureaucratic modes of mobility as well as a vast network of non-university institutions.

Furthermore the partners are building three knowledge hubs concerned with

the aforementioned topics, a School of Public Governance plus a Think and Do Tank under the project's guideline. The hubs will work as interdisciplinary spaces where the public and the universities will engage and where students and researchers will conduct research-oriented learning together.

Circle U.'s mission is to bring together students, researchers and the public sector to lead the way in dealing with our time's great challenges and to further health, peace and democracy for our planet's future.
