Priorities and Project Activities

- Primarily the financing of staff positions at LMU units involved in EUGLOH, in order to increase academic quality and further develop management structures; in particular:
- Support for **project management** in the International Office.
- Transfer of the “**Dissemination**” area of responsibility in the redefined WP 8 to Universität Hamburg as part of the **integration** of the new partner university into EUGLOH 2.0.
- Strengthening the **academic and content-related participation** of the LMU academia in EUGLOH 2.0 in terms of academic and teaching coordination in the Center for International Health.
- Development of activities for the creation of an **intercultural campus** (especially within WP 5) with the participation of the Institute for Intercultural Communication.
- Development of the podcast series “**Radio EUGLOH**” as a complementary contribution to the lifelong learning measures (WP 4) by the Graduate Centre.

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
