## Priorities and Project Activities

Strengthening of research collaboration within the alliance through targeted networking formats and measures (financial and administrative support):

- Organization of **matchmaking workshops** in Hamburg with the participation of researchers from at least 3 alliance partners: funding of travel and accommodation costs for participants.
- **Short research stays** of early career researchers: funding of travel and accommodation costs in Hamburg and at partner universities for up to one month.
- **Final Conference 2026**: funding of travel and accommodation costs for researchers.
